Context

The Centro Universitario de Arte, Arquitectura y Diseño (CUAAD) of the University of Guadalajara (UDG) conducts, supports and facilitates innovative, world-leading, high-impact research across urbanism and planning in Jalisco and across Mexican territory.

The CUAAD's main campus is located in *Huentitán El Alto*, in the municipality of Guadalajara. We provide an exceptionally well-stocked library, research offices, administrative support and technical services and equipment, and knowledge-sharing and funding opportunities for scholars at all stages of their careers.

The post holder will be part of an international research team at University College London led by Prof. Ayona Datta (PI). This is a five-year (2022-2026) European Research Council (ERC) Advanced Grant-funded project, "Regional Futures: The territorial politics of digitalization-as-urbanisation in the global south".

The appointment will be for three years, starting on 1st October 2023. This position has a probationary period in line with the policies of UDG (CUAAD) and requires full-time dedication.

Main purpose of the job

Reporting directly to Dr Demerutis, the post holder will work as part of an international research team led by Prof. Ayona Datta on the European Research Council (ERC) Advanced Grant-funded project, "Regional Futures: The territorial politics of digitalization-as-urbanisation in the global south". With expertise across urban and digital geography in the global south, the post holder will work closely with team members to support the development of a research programme on regional futures in the global south along three thematic foci: digitalising state, information infrastructures and territorial politics. Team members are located in Mumbai, Nairobi, and Guadalajara, and the post-holder will be expected to work closely with team members and report regularly to Prof. Datta as project lead. Fluency in speaking and reading English and Spanish is essential. See the project website for further details: www.regionalfutures.org

Duties and responsibilities

 Work in a highly collaborative manner with team members and maintain regular communication with PI, Collaborator, and across the team.

- Assist in identifying and contacting key informants and stakeholders to conduct the required research programme.
- Conduct archival and field research to collect relevant and high-quality data and work collaboratively with other team members.
- Conduct research within communities using semi-structured interviews, focus groups and participatory methods, and participant observation of public consultation meetings organised by community leaders and state officials.
- Transcribe and translate documents, audio/video clips and field interviews from Spanish to English.
- Assist with the coding and analysis of data for the project in collaboration with PDRA, including interviews, interpretation of observations and documentary analysis.
- Ethically conduct research and follow all UDG, UCL and ERC ethical protocols.
- Record, transfer and safely store (according to Data Protection rules of all participating countries) interview material, transcripts, documents, and personal information for research.
- Be efficient in personal time management and be meticulous in maintaining time sheets to fulfil funder obligations.
- Work with the team to maintain detailed and accurate records of all project documentation, including team meetings and communications.
- Contribute to the project website through blogs, working papers, and other public-facing outputs.
- Assist in and support the project team in organising at least three local stakeholder workshops in line with project objectives.
- Deliver a detailed report at the end of each year with the supervision of PI and collaborator, including findings and research analysis.
- To deliver outputs on time and to agreed specifications with project PI and other team members.
- Assist in and provide support to the project team during field visits.
- Assist in, and contribute to, the dissemination of project findings in appropriate academic and stakeholder settings.
- Maintain own continuing professional development through the above activities.
- Actively engage with the research community and environment of the BIEA.

As duties and responsibilities change, the job description will be reviewed and amended in consultation with the post holder. Job descriptions cannot be exhaustive, so the post holder will carry out any other duties within the job's scope, spirit and purpose as



requested by the line manager Dr Demerutis and/or PI (Prof. Datta). The post holder will actively follow all UDG and UCL-relevant policies.

The post holder will carry out duties in a resource-efficient way.

How to apply:

Applications should include:

- Your full CV (max five pages including publications)
- A 2-page statement, based on the information on the project website, about how your current research interests fit into the "Regional Futures" project.
- A sample of written work (could be a sample from master's thesis)
- One reference from your current employer (or supervisor) and the details of two further referees whom the UDG may contact.

Shortlisted candidates will be asked to share one piece of published writing with the panel before the interview.
